



NATIONAL WILDLIFE REFUGE

H u n t i n g R e g u l a t i o n s

Ash Meadows National Wildlife Refuge is managed by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service. Ash Meadows is an oasis – one of the few remaining spring-fed wetlands in the Mojave Desert. The Refuge was established to protect threatened and endangered animal and plant species, many of which are found only in Ash Meadows. Your efforts to help protect this rare environment is greatly appreciated.



- *Hunting of Upland Gamebirds.* We allow hunting of quail and rabbit in accordance with State and refuge-specific regulations on designated areas of the refuge. See Map for closed areas on the refuge.
- *Hunting of Migratory Game birds.* We allow hunting of geese, ducks, coots, moorhens, snipe, and doves in accordance with State and refuge-specific regulations on designated areas of the refuge. See Map for closed areas on the refuge.
- *Firearms.* Firearms must be unloaded and dismantled or cased while in vehicles.
- You may possess only approved non-toxic shot while out in the field.
- Refuge hours are extended for hunting from one hour before sunrise until one hour after sunset.
- Shooting is NOT permitted from, upon, or across any maintained refuge road.
- Shotgun shells are litter; please dispose of properly.
- Dogs reduce crippling losses. The use of retrievers and upland game bird dogs is encouraged during designated hunting season. Dogs must be leashed at all other times.
- Only motorless boats, or boats with electric motors are allowed on the refuge and only in Crystal and Peterson Reservoirs
- Be aware that during wet weather, unimproved roads on the refuge may become impassible. Please stay on designated roads at all times during your visit
- There are several private landowners within the refuge. Please use extreme caution and discretion when discharging firearms around private property or areas where the general public may be.
- Please report any acts of vandalism, poaching, littering, or any other violation to the Refuge Manager 775-372-5435. After hours contact Lake Mead Dispatch at 702-293-8998/8999.

Please be aware of the following signs that you may come in contact with while on the refuge:



Motorized vehicles not allowed beyond this sign. This restriction protects wildlife habitat and sensitive species.



For use by refuge employees and persons with permission from the Refuge Manager only.



This area is closed to hunting for safety of the general public or as escape/resting cover for waterfowl and water birds.

Normal Refuge hours are from sunrise to sunset daily. Office hours are Monday-Friday 8:00am to 4:30pm. We may also be open on Saturdays when volunteers or staff is available. Interested in volunteering? Please inquire within the office or call 775 372-5435.
