Executive Summary

The Homeland Security and Defense Education Consortium (HSDEC) requested a report that reviewed the academic programs that now comprise the homeland security academic environment. Publicly available data was gathered and this information formed the basis of the analytic judgments contained in this report. The schools and programs listed, and their accompanying information, are the product of interaction with homeland security consortiums, discussions with academic colleagues, review of school brochures and online material, and receipt of university press releases.

The homeland security academic discipline is currently an evolving ungoverned environment of numerous programs purporting to prepare students for various positions of responsibility. Many of today's homeland security offerings are an amalgam of pre-9/11 programs and courses that have since been revised to reflect some undetermined level of education and instruction in homeland security issues. Homeland security programs can take numerous forms including: certificate, associates, bachelor, masters, and doctoral. While commonalities do exist in the course offerings of many of these programs, it appears many programs were established using current institutional courses that have since been revised to address homeland security related issues. As the discipline continues to mature, program commonalities, core teaching areas, and course standardization may emerge that shape the homeland security academic environment and produce graduates conversant on a standard set of homeland security topics. Many in the profession of homeland security seek such standardization; however, some members of the academic community and other homeland security professionals are concerned that the diversity of issues related to the discipline does not lend itself to identifiable core teachings. Using homeland security topics as the foundation, some in the academic community have suggested emphasis on teaching critical analytic thinking skills and imaginative approaches to problem solving rather than focusing on contemporary security-related issues.

Based on a review of the available data it does not appear that the homeland security academic environment has matured to the point that common core courses are being taught at any level of higher education. To date, formal program or course recommendations have not been offered to the bodies currently supporting homeland security academic development. The DHS University System was recently established to address training and education efforts for current Departmental employees. As this System matures, it is possible that DHS will attempt to identify homeland security areas of focus that could form the core of future academic offerings. However, before there is agreement and recognition of homeland security as an academic undertaking, there needs to be acceptance and an understanding of the discipline as a profession.

Most homeland security practitioners and academicians agree that greater attention is needed to the role and utility of homeland security as a permanent and well-understood discipline. Many agree that in order for the field to mature the homeland security environment must be further defined which in turn would support the development of core educational objectives.

Scope of Research and Related Notes

At the request of the Homeland Security and Defense Education Consortium (HSDEC), the authors undertook a report to review the academic programs that now comprise the homeland security academic environment. The goal of this effort included:

- a catalog of current academic programs teaching homeland security courses;
- an analysis of the current state of the homeland security academic environment, including trends and projections; and
- recommendations that may assist maturing the homeland security academic discipline.

Publicly available data was gathered and this information formed the basis of the analytic judgments contained in this report. The level of detail accompanying each academic institution noted in the accompanying annexes varied greatly. The level of detail ranged from the detailed descriptions of the program, required and elective courses offered, and the biographies of the instructors teaching the courses to simply mentioning that the school has a program in homeland security with no accompanying detail. Given the scope of this effort and the lack of detailed data provided by the universities the report does not undertake and in-depth assessment of each program noted in the accompanying annexes. The focus of the report is on the homeland security academic environment in general and not a specific school or program.

Data collection for this report initiated in December 2006 and concluded in May 2007. During the course of this project, the author's quickly realized that new homeland security academic programs are established frequently. As such, the authors needed to choose a definitive data collection cutoff date to allow for data processing, reconciliation, and analysis. The schools and programs listed and their accompanying information are the product of interaction with homeland security consortiums, discussions with academic colleagues, review of school brochures and online material, and receipt of university press releases. While we are confident that the majority of academic institutions supporting homeland security programs are reflected in this report, undoubtedly some schools and programs have unintentionally been excluded.

I. Introduction

The evolving academic field of homeland security is in a “pre-paradigm phase as a professional discipline.”¹ Since 9/11, many academic programs have been established, previously existing programs have been revised and new courses and programs are frequently emerging that reflect homeland security teachings. A few studies have previously reviewed various aspects of the homeland security academic environment.² This report describes the current homeland security academic landscape, the status of homeland security as a discipline, and offer suggestions regarding issues to consider as the discipline matures.

II. Defining Homeland Security

One concern often noted by university leaders that have, or have considered, establishing a homeland security academic program was defining what the discipline³ entails. The federal government defines homeland security as “a concerted national effort to prevent terrorist attacks within the United States, reduce America’s vulnerability to terrorism, and minimize the damage and recover from attacks that do occur.”⁴ The National Strategy for Homeland Security lists essential areas of focus that appear to have been considered by many academic programs.⁵ However, it is important to note that the current national strategy for homeland security

definition was largely developed by the federal government and is void of issues relating to natural disasters. If the federal definition of homeland security is to be the basis of homeland security programs, but lacks recognition of the non-federal entities with homeland security responsibilities and is also shortsighted in recognizing the all-hazards nature of incidents, academia may wish to expand its view of the homeland security environment when establishing relevant curriculum.

As the discipline evolves, issues deemed homeland security-related appear to be expanding outside the current working definition of homeland security. Whether a terrorist incident, natural disaster, or incident of unknown cause, one might argue that the current trend is to deem any activity that may have tangential negative societal security implications as having a nexus to homeland security. If the future of homeland security continues the trend toward a boundless view of the field, school administrators may struggle with determining the courses to be taught in a program that purports to prepare students for this new discipline. Such a dynamic might suggest a need for greater emphasis on critical thinking skills needed to address a myriad of homeland security issues rather than attempting to keep pace with an ever-changing landscape of security specific topics.

III. The Emergence of Homeland Security Academic Programs

While the term homeland security pre-dates the attacks of September 11, 2001, homeland security as an academic discipline was not widely discussed until after 9/11. Many courses in pre-existing academic disciplines are now taught in homeland security programs and were previously studied under the academic specialties of civil defense, disaster relief, and emergency management. In the post 9/11 environment, many schools have established or refined current programs to reflect a homeland security offering. It appears that some of the programs were established after considerable thought regarding the objectives of the program, courses offered, and selection of instructors, while others appear to have simply changed the name of existing courses to reflect a homeland security focus.

School literature reviewed in support of this report identified many academic institutions stating that they were the first university to offer a homeland security program at a given educational level. While this seemingly harmless marketing tactic could easily be dismissed, the discipline may suffer as such claims could convey a sense of program superiority to prospective students and homeland security organizations wishing to hire competent degreed recipients. Consistent with an overarching theme of this report, absent a governing or accrediting body to regulate programs offering homeland security education, and barring internal organizational oversight, schools that have autonomy to advertise, teach, and graduate students may send individuals into the homeland security environment that are ill-equipped for the rigors of the jobs to which they are selected.⁶ While some of the school literature did not note when the homeland

security program was established, a review of descriptive material associated with the schools did reveal that many of the academic programs claim to have been started in response to employer demands for homeland security professionals.⁷

IV. Homeland Security Academic Programs: Commonalties and Distinctions

With the opportunity to assist the country in a time of need and gain access to a steadily increasing amount of student, federal, state, local, and private sector funds many schools have established programs that purport to teach the issues commonly addressed in the homeland security environment. However, the current homeland security academic programs are recognizable in name only with many of the courses and required reading material varying greatly. The following list offers observations related to current homeland security academic programs.⁸

- Most of the homeland security programs are organizationally located within a pre-existing department at a school. Others programs appear to be unaffiliated with a pre-existing department.
- As identified by title, many of the programs have core/required courses in common.
- It appears some of the programs were established using existing course offerings as the foundation. Consistent with these efforts it appears some programs reconfigured current course offerings to reflect a homeland security focus or developed courses based on the expertise of on-hand or recently hired instructors.
- Some of the programs have received formal approval by university boards or state accrediting bodies. Much of the literature describing a school's program makes no mention of whether the program is formally approved or recognized.
- Many of the programs state that graduates will be qualified to gain homeland security employment but such claims appear questionable based on the immature nature of the homeland security field.
- Some of the programs state that they work in cooperation with a federal or state government entity in shaping their program.
- The majority of programs appear to teach homeland security from the federal government's perspective. It is not apparent from most of the program descriptions what teachings support a student's understanding of the homeland security environment from the state, local, tribal, private sector, and international perspective.
- Many of the programs refer to federal homeland security related legislation, Executive Orders, and Homeland Security Presidential Directives as the foundation from which courses are taught. With that said, commonality with respect to homeland security program required readings and common literature does not exist. Some of the

programs use federal government resources, others rely exclusively on books or reports that speak to homeland security issues, while others simply use links to various homeland security related websites.

The commonalities and differences listed above do not argue for a model or homogenous academic program for each level of study. In fact, quite the contrary might be needed to support the homeland security academic environment. Just as students develop core foundational understanding of a given field in the required courses of well established disciplines; and subsequently focus on specific areas of interest in upper level courses and graduate studies, the homeland security academic environment may likewise evolve. As the discipline matures and foundational courses become common, schools may choose to offer degrees that specialize in one of the numerous areas that currently comprise the homeland security environment.⁹

V. Academic Levels of Homeland Security Programs

The report has identified homeland security programs at every academic level from certificate programs to PhD and at all types of academic institutions from traditional brick and mortar colleges and universities, local and regional community colleges and, most recently, to the blossoming online environment.

Programs are growing in numbers at a rate that is difficult to track. For example, during the course of the data collection effort supporting this report (December 2006 -May 2007) we observed an increase in identifiable homeland security academic programs from 215 to 227.¹⁰ This unconstrained and largely uncoordinated proliferation of programs, coupled with the lack of a national governing body or oversight mechanism, is one of the principle reasons for this report. An expressed goal of this report is "...to foster a conversation among our member institutions regarding what a program in homeland security ought to look like, and to facilitate a more robust network of cooperation and coordination between these institutions."¹¹

The academic program numeric results are the product of a review of all *known* schools claiming to have a currently established homeland security program. While homeland security programs are numerous they are not easily found on an academic institution's web site. A review of known programs reveals: the name of the degree conferred was not always indicative of underlying courses of study; numerous programs that pre-existed 9/11 have subsequently been renamed homeland security (nexus to homeland security is suspect in some cases); and many programs have course titles with similar names but vastly different course descriptions.¹²

More disparate than the numbers and types of programs are the nearly 1800 identified courses associated with these programs.¹⁵

Based on a review of available data it does not appear that the homeland security academic environment has matured to the point that common core requirements are taught at any level of higher education. Given the evolution of national homeland security missions and what skills

may be desired of a homeland security professional, many in the field argue that now may not be the time to attempt a standardization of programs and accompanying courses. Alternatively, some homeland security administrators would counter this sentiment by suggesting that academia has a responsibility to help define the homeland security environment and, as such, it is perfectly reasonable to start putting in place courses containing common teaching requirements while retaining the ability to make changes as the field evolves.

Over the past year, some administrators and instructors in the homeland security academic community have started discussing the utility of proposing common homeland security education requirement standards and courses.¹⁶ Such efforts are preliminary in nature and have not led to formal recommendations regarding homeland security programs or their underlying courses. Some involved in these discussions suggest that the task of setting minimal academic standards for this new discipline is currently unattainable since the field of homeland security, and a workable definition of the profession, has yet to be sufficiently identified to support such an effort. Others see the immaturity of the profession as an opportunity for the academic community to help shape the homeland security environment. Most agree that as the homeland security environment evolves, homeland security academic programs will continue to proliferate with the placement of many degreed students of varying levels of knowledge and competence hired into positions with homeland security responsibilities.

VI. DHS Academic Support Activities

Recently the DHS Office of the Chief Learning Officer released its University Programs Strategic Plan.¹⁷ The plan focuses on issues such as internal departmental training activities, training for new, mid-level, and senior employees, and meeting common federal government training and education requirements. The strategy document does not address issues related to the role of academia in preparing students for homeland security positions, offer suggested areas of study to become a well-rounded or specialized homeland security practitioner, or suggest required knowledge and skills to fulfill federal, state, local, or private sector homeland security missions.

In cooperation with the Department's Chief Learning Officer, the DHS' Science and Technology Directorate oversees the department's University Programs. The mission of the Directorate is to "stimulate, coordinate, leverage, and utilize the unique intellectual capital in the academic community to address current and future homeland security challenges, and educate and inspire the next generation homeland security workforce."¹⁸ The objectives of the Directorate's University Program include "fostering a homeland security culture within the

academic community through research and educational programs and creating and leveraging intellectual capital and nurture a homeland security science and engineering workforce.”¹⁹

The DHS University System was recently established to address training and education efforts for current Departmental employees. In coordination with both of the efforts mentioned above, as the System matures it is possible that DHS will attempt to identify the many multi-faceted and multi-jurisdictional homeland security areas of focus that could in turn assist in informing future academic offerings. At present, the DHS University Center is comprised of “four centers that support a comprehensive and networked approach to developing Department employees at all levels.”²⁰ DHS describes the four centers and their associated tasks as:²¹

- *Leadership Institute* — preparing and growing leaders throughout the Department at every level by establishing programs and methods that deliver essential leadership training at career milestones
- *Preparedness Center* — establishing a culture of preparedness throughout the Department by offering programs that build awareness of the Department’s protection and response capabilities in a multi-threat/all-hazards environment by establishing a network of DHS-recognized interagency and national preparedness training programs
- *Homeland Security Academy* — cultivating homeland security strategic analysis and decision-making skills through a high-quality, fully-accredited graduate degree program in Homeland Security Studies
- *Center for Academic and Interagency Programs* — establishing and maintaining partnerships and linkages with interagency and academic community counterparts to optimize current best practices and provide DHS employees with the highest quality training, education and professional development opportunities available in the integrated homeland security learning community.

VII. Organizations Shaping the Homeland Security Academic Environment

Homeland Security and Defense and Education Consortium

The Homeland Security and Defense Education Consortium (HSDEC) is a network of teaching and research institutions focused on promoting education, research, and cooperation related to and supporting homeland security and homeland defense missions. The consortium is committed to building and maintaining a community of higher education institutions supporting this mission and the overall homeland security effort through the sharing and advancement of knowledge.²² The HSDEC is uniquely positioned to integrate and support the needs of the Department of Defense, homeland defense, and homeland security academic and research communities. Through its ongoing relationships with federal government departments and academic institutions, the HSDEC serves as the forum for the development, enrichment, and propagation of the science and art of homeland security and homeland defense through research, teaching, and outreach.²³

The Center for Homeland Defense and Security

The Naval Postgraduate School's Center for Homeland Defense and Security (CHDS) has been the nation's premier provider of homeland security graduate and executive level education since 2002.²⁴ NPS and the U.S. Department of Homeland Security are collaborating to pioneer the development and delivery of homeland security education programs for governors, mayors and senior homeland security leaders from across a wide spectrum of disciplines in local, tribal, state and federal government, and the military.²⁵ Given CHDS' time in the homeland security academic environment, its ongoing interaction with homeland security entities throughout the Nation, the use of its graduate program as a model for numerous other universities, and the collaborative activities occurring with DHS, many institutions look to this organization for guidance on homeland security academic issues.

National Academic Consortium for Homeland Security

The National Academic Consortium for Homeland Security (Consortium) comprises public and private academic institutions engaged in activities related to current and future U.S. national security challenges.²⁶ The primary role of the Consortium is to promote, support and enhance academic research, technology development, education and training, and service programs

dealing with all aspects of international and homeland security. The specific objectives of the Consortium are to:²⁷

- Improve understanding of national security issues.
- Promote development of better-informed public policy, strategy, and plans and programs regarding national security issues.
- Develop new technologies and transition those technologies into effective, practical and affordable solutions to (current and future) international and homeland security problems.
- Educate and train the people required by governmental and non-governmental organizations to accomplish international and homeland security roles and responsibilities.

Homeland Defense and Security Education Summit - February 2007

In February 2007, the first Homeland Security Education Summit took place just outside the Nation's capital. Funded by the CHDS and the HSDEC, and supported by DHS' Office of the Chief Learning Officer and the Critical Infrastructure Protection Program of George Mason University, the conference was attended by over 200 individuals from more than 125 institutions of higher learning and leaders from the U.S. Congress and the Executive Branch. The summit was the largest gathering to date of educators and trainers focused primarily on homeland defense and security education.²⁸ The primary goals of the event were to "relate DHS and Department of Defense homeland security education goals and objectives to academia, provide researchers an opportunity to present their work, showcase curriculum and programs, and build and strengthen networks of homeland security educators."²⁹

VIII. Homeland Security Academic Successes and Challenges

Successes

While this field is experiencing many of the growing pains that accompany any new venture, there are positive activities occurring that suggest a future discipline capable of helping shape and significantly add to the homeland security environment. Employer and student demand have necessitated a desire of many schools to see the patriotic and financial viability of establishing a program to meet the needs of current and future security issues. Given world events, employment trends, and the desire of many Americans to serve their country, the opportunity will exist for the foreseeable future for those wishing to establish or refine a homeland security program. While many successes in the homeland security academic environment lay ahead, a number of positive activities are currently occurring. A few such items are:

- While not universally accepted the homeland security academic discipline appears to be gaining recognition
- Program growth and student interest in the homeland security academic environment is increasing
- Collaboration between academic institutions is starting to occur with frequency
- Student recruitment and retention numbers in homeland security programs appear to be steadily rising
- The first homeland security graduates have recently entered or returned to the workforce

Challenges and Issues to Consider

To date, neither homeland security organizations nor the academic community have reached consensus on what constitutes a homeland security course, let alone a coherent program. In an effort to attract federal funding, recruit new students, and prepare graduates for careers in the expanding field of homeland security, universities are augmenting existing courses and launching entire programs around security, defense, and terrorism related issues. Some schools focus only on homeland security research while others concentrate their efforts on degree granting programs and certificates.

At this stage of the homeland security academic maturation process it appears programs and accompanying courses will provide dissimilar and inconsistent learning opportunities for the foreseeable future. This may be due in part to how the programs were designed, the choice in course offerings, and the quality of teaching put forth by a given university. Before there is agreement and recognition of homeland security as an academic undertaking, there needs to be acceptance and an understanding of the discipline as a profession. With projections of significant security-trained employee retirements occurring over the next decade, employers will be seeking large numbers of new employees.³⁰ DHS alone employs an estimated 180,000 people. Add in

state and private sector security positions, and demand for college graduates well versed in addressing the numerous aspects of homeland security is likely to outpace supply.

The impact of retiring federal employees and other individuals departing the federal government for private sector employment is certain to affect the homeland and national security communities. With 40% of the federal workforce having entered service since 9/11 and projections for significant numbers of retirements over the next decade, it is now more important than ever that recent graduates hired by the federal government to be capable of fulfilling the expectations of the hiring organizations. With many recently educated homeland security professionals soon joining private sector, state, and federal government homeland security organizations, hiring managers will have expectations that the academic institutions taught courses reflecting the current and evolving security environment as well as helped develop the necessary critical thinking skills needed to be successful in an evolving field.

Other challenges and issues to consider regarding the homeland security academic environment:

- An ever-expanding field of homeland security programs not assessed or governed by an independent and objective oversight body. Some homeland security academic observers suggest the establishment of a recognized governing body to oversee and advise schools offering homeland security programs.
- Building multidisciplinary and interdisciplinary programs that have core educational requirements while retaining the flexibility to adjust to changes in the homeland security environment.
- Balancing national homeland security needs with the institutional need for branding and funding.
- Balancing the breadth and depth of programs required to fully address the homeland security environment.
- Lack of qualified instructors and questionable quality of instruction.
- Providing homeland security students practical experience prior to entering the profession. Some universities assist this process by offering experiential learning, internships, exercise participation, and service learning opportunities.
- Emphasizing research and critical analytic thinking skills required to address the numerous unforeseen issues that will arise in the homeland security environment.
- As the academic field matures, programs may consider specializing in one of the many aspects of homeland security.
