Mrs. [REDACTED] was telephonically interviewed on December 14, 1953, by Special Agent Edward P. Brown of the Crime Records Section upon referral from the Director's Office.

Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she recently rented a house through her real estate agent, one Mr. [REDACTED] of the Georgetown Section, to a tenant by the name of Mr. Jackson, full name unknown. Last Saturday she met him for the first time when she went to the house occupied by him. She stated that she wants to sell the house. She advised that Mr. Jackson has "fixed up" the living room as an office and has a map on the wall with big dots on it. He told Mrs. [REDACTED] that these dots represent his territory, that he sells surgical instruments, that he has about \$3,000 to \$3,500 worth of samples in the basement, and that he does not see the merchandise he sells since it is sent directly from his company to the customers. Mrs. [REDACTED] stated that she is suspicious of him because of the fact that he does not see the merchandise he sells and because he is a foreigner. She wanted the FBI to investigate him because she does not want any suspicious tenants living in her house.

She was advised that in view of the fact that there is no evidence or complaint of a violation of a Federal law, the FBI has no authority to investigate this matter.

He said if we would supply the telephone number to him he would assure us that he would get the missing \$300,000 ransom back. In addition, would get a Cadillac for himself out of Greenlease. He volunteered the information that Greenlease still had the other \$300,000 and described him, in addition to other phrases and words as an "old shylock."

At 12:20 P.M., February 6, 1954, a call from captioned individual was referred from the Director's Office to SA Gordon E. Malmfeldt in the Crime Records Section. He has called the Bureau on numerous times in the past and said that he liked to talk to Agents since all "FBI people" were such gentlemen. He did state that he was a veteran and a lover of "McCarthy."

Bufiles reflect that he has called on several other occasions and furnished innocuous information.

According to [redacted] the subject resides on [redacted] Baltimore County, Maryland.

Although [redacted] exhibited no indications of insanity in his conversation, his claims and description concerning the afore-mentioned "rays" were very vague and unexplained.

He advised that he had previously reported this situation which he considers a threat against him to local police departments in the Baltimore area, had been to the Federal Communications Commission Office in Baltimore and to other agencies without success.
