Good: Safety material, posters and magazines offer you and your Sailors information to stay safe and to reduce mishaps. Making those items easily available, like this rack found during a safety survey, is one way to work at reducing mishaps.

Bad: Safety signs are placed around ships, hangars and equipment for a reason. If you disregard these warnings, like this one found during another survey, the chances of a mishap in your spaces will increase.
