Dear Mr. Hoyt:

Following the welcome visit of yourself and Dr. Little to the office on January 4, we gave careful study to your invitation to join TIRC. In reviewing the position we were particularly aware of the importance to the industry of the study presently being made by the Surgeon General's Committee and of the importance to all of us of the manner in which the industry deals with that Committee. We all clearly have a duty to be sure that the Surgeon General's Committee receives all available information, particularly since it is clear that they will be pounded with information which does not rise above the level of propaganda.

Before your visit, we had established a relationship with the Committee which we are satisfied will result in advantages to all in the industry and in that connection have arranged to present to the Committee a report which will reflect the results of a very large body of work done for us over a long period of years by the A. D. Little organization and our own people at Durham. Things having got as far along as they have, we have concluded for the present we will not accept your invitation believing ~~as we do~~
