

Re: T.D. Sterling: Feasibility Study on  
Office Environments

Gentlemen:

Dr. Sterling's Feasibility Study on Office Environments was funded this past summer with a budget of \$9,900.00. We are pleased to report that Dr. Sterling has been promised cooperation for his study of buildings and union workers. He has also had discussions with government personnel about the NIOSH data on office buildings throughout the United States. Presently he is evaluating the advisability of analyzing these data.

During meetings with Dr. Sterling we have discussed the research methods planned to obtain data on the workers, measurements of levels of particulates and other substances in buildings, and information on design features and ventilation capabilities. We have suggested that Dr. Sterling prepare a more extensive proposal with more detailed research protocols than originally envisioned. This should provide much more complete information on which to base a decision of whether or not the office environment project should be supported. As a result of our request, Dr. Sterling has asked for a budgetary supplement in the amount of \$3,150.00, part of which is to be used for architectural consultants.
