I believe you will be interested in the enclosed paper by Mancuso, Coulter and Macdonald entitled "Migration and Cancer Mortality Experience--A Study of Native and Southern Born Nonwhite Ohio Residents". This paper was presented during June of 1972 but was just recently published in "Trace Substances in Environmental Health - VI".

You will be especially interested in the authors' comments on cancer of the lung, which appear at page 53. In part they state:

"Since in the U.S. the proportion of heavy smokers among the white males was almost double that for the nonwhite males, and heavy smoking of the nonwhites was less common in the South than elsewhere, some other factors appear to be contributing in the marked rise in lung cancer mortality among the nonwhites and the further change in their relative position in 1959-1963."
