You will recall that at the last meeting of counsel in Washington, D.C., we advised you of past contacts with Dr. George Wolf at MIT concerning some work that he was doing which sounded interesting. His financing for much of his work was coming from MIT and he did not feel at liberty to give us information concerning details on his projects in order for us to consider a proposal for our financing.

You will further recall that Dr. Wolf did indicate to us the possibility of our financing two fellowships of persons who would be working on the projects in which we had some interest. After considerable discussion, each of you indicated that you would recommend sponsoring the two fellowships as proposed by Dr. Wolf but you requested that I check to be sure that the two men would be working on Dr. Wolf's Vitamin A project.

It was requested that we write the proposal up and send it to you. This is to advise that Bill Shinn contacted Dr. Wolf and it was Dr. Wolf's suggestion that the matter of financing the fellowships be deferred until he gets his projects' financing cleared in October. Since everyone indicated approval of the idea and since I was to get a write-up on the project, I wanted you to know the reason for the delay.
