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Congressional Hearings

Dear Frank:

I enclose a draft of a statement which Earle Clements asked us to work up that he could use as he saw fit with Congressional Committee members behind the scenes. I read the statement in prior draft form to Bill Bates and he had no exception to take to it. There really has been no substantial revision since then and I have sent a revised copy to him in any event.

The decision was made this morning to ask Dr. Kensler to work up a draft statement on the labeling of "tar" and nicotine yield. There has been no decision to use Dr. Kensler as a witness or even to file his statement, but it seems to me we should be prepared to combat this additional feature of Senator Magnuson's bill. As you know, it was doubtless inserted because of Senator Neuberger's position. She has since introduced a bill on her own which would require labeling of packages with the yield of "incriminating substances" determined to be so by the Federal Trade Commission.

Obviously the attached also helps to disclose the misleading nature of any such proposed requirement.
