

This is a supplemental recommendation to the Gorlin project proposal sent to you on June 8. That proposal, to date, has been approved by Brown & Williamson, Philip Morris and R. J. Reynolds. American has declined to participate and Lorillard is still considering the matter.

After further consultation with Dr. Gorlin, we have concluded that this project should be funded through the Heart Research Foundation, 1212 Fifth Avenue, New York. The Heart Research Foundation (see enclosure) would be willing to receive the grant and fund the work without overhead charges.

The scope of the research would be broadened to give Dr. Gorlin more flexibility. The general purpose of the research would be described additionally as follows:

Acute myocardial infarction and other indications of myocardial ischemia have been related to a number of factors. Often the event is preceded by emotional crises or highly stressful events, excess physical activity, ingestion of certain foods or a combination of these and other phenomena. In patients with ischemic heart disease or a prior history of myocardial infarction, these same phenomena or perhaps others may be involved in the development of myocardial infarction. The investigation will



study behavioral and environmental factors that may precede acute ischemic events such as myocardial infarction with special emphasis on patients with existent heart disease.

We propose that this project be funded by a grant to the Heart Research Foundation by market share. Payment would be made yearly for three years in equal amounts of \$100,000. This is slightly less than the total (\$312,774) requested in the June 8 letter.

A response at the Committee of Counsel meeting scheduled for September 2 would be greatly appreciated.
