
In reference to your request last week, I will be glad to extend Covington and Burling an additional 30 days to formalize our agreement as to the specifics governing the operation of the I S & R system.

With regard to the meeting on Friday, January 20th, 1967, I would like to acknowledge the major change in the I S & R program, that is the deletion of abstracting (abstracts as opposed to annotations) and the acceptance of the four (4) level system of indexing.

The specifics of the annotation preparation as well as the levels of indexing are being written and will be forwarded to the project officer as soon as possible.

With the above changes the estimated cost for preparation of the estimated 1000 documents per month, from March 7, 1967 to March 7, 1968, is \$15,200 per month plus the computer fee of \$3,500 per month for a total estimated monthly fee of \$18,700.
